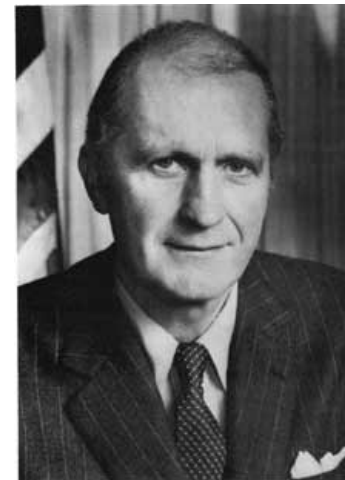

- National resource

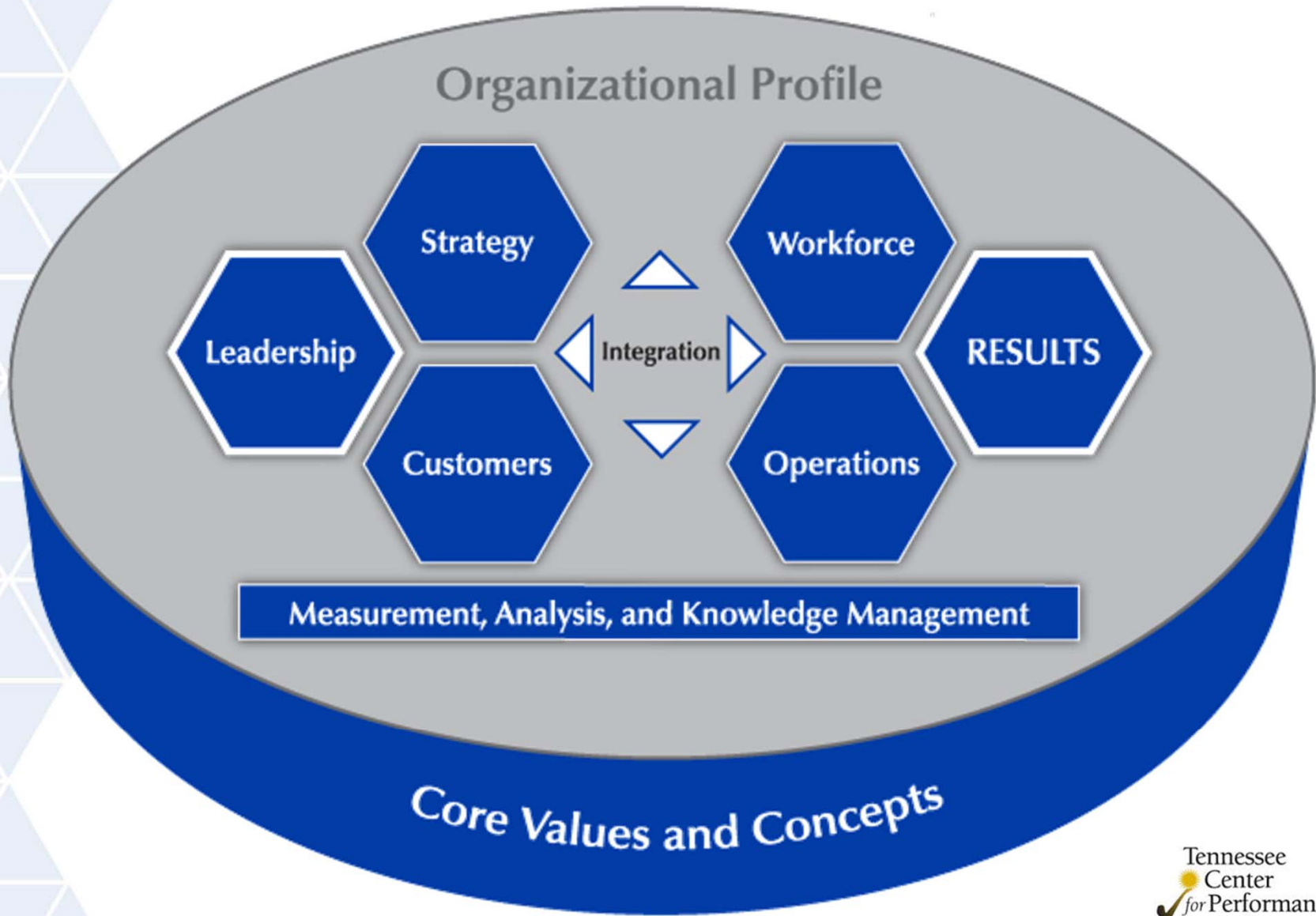

Framework for Performance Excellence

- Common sense

- Examiners sign a Non-disclosure Agreement and Conflict of Interest Statement

- No contact or consulting with applicant after site visit
- No gifts or considerations accepted
- No results of the site visit or application assessment will be provided on-site
